## **UCAS** Application



- Centralised on-line application system for UK universities
- On-line registration opens at the beginning of September 2016 for courses starting in September 2017
- Cost £23.00 (£12)
- Choices not ranked

### **Personal Statement**



- Up to 4000 characters
- Demonstrate your interest in your chosen subject
- Reading/work experience/independent study
- Demonstrate your skills and interests
- Sell yourself & show your interest
- Workshop & Head of House support

- Application fee: £16 + audition fees
- References: Academic & Practical

- 25<sup>th</sup> February
- All 5 choices used? No offers? Changed your mind?
- Submit additional choices: one at a time
- New Personal Statement
- Not all courses available

### Finances: SAAS



- Scottish University Fees
- England fees of up to £9,000
- Living cost loans: £4,750
- £16,910 earnings threshold
- 9 % of monthly salary over threshold
- £20,000 pa, repayment = £19.99 per month (from £1,300)
- Bursaries: means tested income below £34,000
- Scholarships
